## **World Rowing Under 23 Championships General Information**

The World Rowing Under 23 Championships showcase up-and-coming athletes who are no longer eligible to compete at the junior level but are still in need of further development to rank among top senior elite rowers. Held for the first time in 1976 in Macon, France, under the title “Seniors Match,” it eventually became the “Nations Cup” in 1992. FISA’s 2005 Extraordinary Congress in Dubrovnik, Croatia, voted to upgrade the World Rowing Under 23 Regatta to world rowing championship status. The first official World Rowing Under 23 Championships were raced in 2004. Approximately 600 athletes from 40 countries compete annually.

## **2013 World Rowing Under 23 Championships**

This year’s regatta features competition in 21 events: men’s single sculls, women’s single sculls, lightweight men’s single sculls, lightweight women’s single sculls, men’s double sculls, women’s double sculls, lightweight men’s double sculls, lightweight women’s double sculls, men’s pair, women’s pair, lightweight men’s pair, men’s quadruple sculls, women’s quadruple sculls, lightweight men’s quadruple sculls, lightweight women’s quadruple sculls, men’s four, women’s four, lightweight men’s four, men’s four with coxswain, men’s eight and women’s eight. The United States will have crews competing in all but the men’s quad.

## **Linz/Ottensheim, Austria**

Linz, population 191,107, is located on the Danube River and is Austria’s second largest economic center. It features many attractions such as the Ars Electronica Center, St. Mary’s Cathedral and Lentos Museum of Art. The EU has named it a “European Capital of Culture” for 2009. Ottensheim is one of the most popular recreation spots in the Linz area, featuring cycling, rowing and hiking.

Linz greatly expanded during World War II, as Adolf Hitler attempted to make the city an industrial power and cultural center. As a producer of armaments, it suffered great damage from air raids in the later years of the war. After World War II the Danube served as a barrier between Soviet and American troops, with the Americans occupying the area south of the river, including Linz.

The regatta course was built on the Danube River in 1972 and has regularly hosted international regattas and the Austrian Rowing Championships. The World Rowing Junior Championships were held here in 1998.

This June, Austria was hit with a massive flood, the regatta course was left under water and 267,000 cubic meters of mud blocked the course and raised questions about sufficient water depth.

With the help of volunteers and fire brigades, a large portion of the venue was cleaned and repaired and the government of Upper Austria funded the costs of the repair and the regatta is scheduled to take place as planned.

## **A Look Back at the 2012 World Rowing Under 23 Championships**

The United States won three medals at the 2012 World Rowing Under 23 Championships, including a gold in the men's and women's eight and a silver for the men's four with coxswain.

The U.S. men's eight came into Trakai, Lithuania, looking to repeat as under-23 world champions for the first time ever. In Amsterdam in 2011, the U.S. pulled away from the Czech Republic over the final half of the race to take home gold for the fifth time in the history of the event and its equivalents. But unlike the previous four times, this year's crew was able to defend the world title.

With three members of the 2011 crew returning to the men's eight lineup in Tom Dethlefs, Alex Bunkers and Rob Munn, the crew of Sam Ojserkis, Ian Silveira, Dethlefs, Bunkers, Ryan Schroeder, Ambrose Puttmann, Gardner Yost, Munn and Jim Voter began defense of the gold medal in impressive fashion with a wire-to-wire victory in the heat. After a couple of days of waiting, the U.S. was back on the water for the final. Germany took the early lead and held a small advantage at the midway point of the race before the U.S. upped its rate to take a half-length lead coming into the final 500 meters.

The Americans continued to push towards the line as Germany tried to get back on terms. However, the U.S. was able to keep its bow ahead of the Germans, winning by 0.56 seconds. The U.S. finished with a time of 5:47.66, with Germany taking silver and Australia bronze. The win gave the U.S. men's eight its third gold medal and fourth medal overall in the last five years.

In the women's eight, the crew of Kendall Schmidt, Kristine O'Brien, Madison Culp, Heidi Robbins, Chrissy Holm, Gabbie Cole, Taylor Goetzing, Amanda Elmore and Emily Walsh dominated the field, winning the final by open water.

With only five entries, the U.S. competed in a race for lanes, trailing Great Britain at the midway point before pulling away over the final 1,000 meters. In the final, the American crew took the lead off the start.

While the British crew held it close at the 500-meter mark, the U.S. methodically walked away from the field, taking a seven-seat lead by the midway point of the race. The U.S. then shifted into another gear, put the hammer down and expanded its lead to open water in the third 500.

The open-water lead allowed the crew to watch the rest of the field over the final 500 meters. The U.S. crossed the finish line to win the gold medal in a time of 6:25.92, with Germany taking the silver medal and The Netherlands winning bronze. In addition to the two gold medals, the U.S. also brought home a silver medal in the men's four with coxswain, finishing just behind the defending U-23 world champions from Serbia.

In its heat, the crew of Seamus Labrum, Max Mannisto, Patrick Marre, Garrett Rinden and Alex Kornick passed New Zealand in the final strokes to earn the victory and a spot in the final. In the race for the medals, the U.S. trailed Germany early in the race before taking the lead in the second 500 meters. Serbia, which got off the line in sixth, went with the U.S. and was in a virtual dead heat with the American boat at the midway point of the race.

The two crews continued to battle each other the final 1,000 meters with Serbia inching away in the final 300 meters. Serbia finished with a time of 6:34.13 to win the gold medal. The U.S. clocked a 6:35.42 to win silver, while New Zealand won the bronze. The U.S. also had four, fourth-place finishes in Trakai. The men's pair of Austin Hack and Dariush Aghai was in medal contention the entire race before falling just short in the last 250 meters, finishing fourth.

All six crews were within a boat length of each other in the first 500 meters as Great Britain took a slight advantage over South Africa. While the British continued to pull ahead over the final 1,500 meters, Germany, South Africa and the U.S. battled for the final two medals. The U.S. held second position going into the final 500 meters, but South Africa made a huge charge to overtake the U.S. and Germany for silver, with the Germans edging out Hack and Aghai for bronze.

In the final of the lightweight men's double sculls, Nick Trojan and Austin Meyer dropped more than three seconds off the medal pace in the first 500 meters and could never work back into contention for a top-three position. Austria held on to cross the line first, with Poland passing Germany for the silver medal. The fourth-place finish was still the best ever for a U.S. lightweight men's double at the championships.

The men's four of Justin Jones, Will Gillis, Alex Karwoski and Ted Baumgardner also finished fourth. The crew got off to a strong start and held the bronze-medal position through the 1,500-meter mark, but Great Britain put on a furious charge over the final 300 meters to overtake the American boat. Germany won the gold, followed by Australia.

In the lightweight women's quadruple sculls, the crew of Samantha Brecht, Sarah Giancola, Carolina Paini and Cornelia Willis also finished fourth. The crew was in third position, well ahead of The Netherlands, moving through the second quarter of the race before catching a crab just before the 1,000-meter mark. Germany went on to win the gold medal, followed by Italy and The Netherlands.

The U.S. also reached the final in the women's four.
