World Rowing Under 23 Championships General Information

The World Rowing Under 23 Championships showcase up-and-coming athletes who are no longer eligible to compete at the junior level but are still in need of further development to rank among top senior elite rowers. Held for the first time in 1976 in Macon, France, under the title “Seniors Match,” it eventually became the “Nations Cup” in 1992. FISA’s 2005 Extraordinary Congress in Dubrovnik, Croatia, voted to upgrade the World Rowing Under 23 Regatta to world rowing championship status. The first official World Rowing Under 23 Championships were raced in 2004. Approximately 600 athletes from 40 countries compete annually.

2014 World Rowing Under 23 Championships

The five-day competition will feature U.S. crews in 20 events including the men’s and women’s single sculls, lightweight men’s and women’s single sculls, men’s and women’s double sculls, lightweight men’s and women’s double sculls, men’s and women’s quadruple sculls, lightweight women’s quadruple sculls, men’s and women’s pair, lightweight men’s pair, men’s and women’s four, lightweight men’s four, men’s four with coxswain, and men’s and women’s eight.

About Varese, Italy

Located about 50 kilometers from Milan, at the base of the Alpine Foothills, Varese is a province marked by water, valleys and castles. The name, Varese, comes from “var” which means water in the Celtic language. Mountains dominate the north, giving way to hills and valleys and, eventually, flatland in the south. The landscape is embellished with beautiful villas and lovely gardens in the Italian and British styles, as well as parks, bell towers and sheltered villages.

Varese is known as the Land of Seven Lakes and is home to 13 rowing clubs. Approximately 10 lakes of glacial origins make up Varese's environs including Lake Varese, Lake Maggiore, Lake Ceresio and Lake Verbano, fed by a myriad of rivers and streams, such as the Olona and Ticino.

Varese Lake (Lago di Varese in Italian) is a lake of glacial origin in Lombardy, in the north of Italy. It has an area of 14.5 square kilometers and an average depth of 11 meters. Situated at the foot of Mount Campo dei Fiori, it laps the southern territory of Varese (quarter Schiranna) and eight other villages of its Province. The pearl of lake Varese is the “Isolino Virginia,” a unique pre-historical site of international relevance, easy to reach by boat from the village of Biandronno.

It has hosted the Coupe de la Jeunesse in 2007, Italian National Championships in 2009, the Swiss National Trials in 2009 and most recently, the 2012 European Rowing Championships. Lake Varese has been part of Natura 2000. This is the European Union’s large system of protected areas, which safeguard rare or endangered species and habitats.

A Look Back at the 2013 World Rowing Under 23 Championships

Of the 20 U.S. crews that traveled to Austria to compete among the top under 23 rowers in the world, four returned home with medals at the conclusion of racing on the Linz-Ottensheim course. Highlighting the regatta, lightweight single sculler Andrew Campbell won the first-ever U.S. under 23 gold medal in the event, the women's eight defended its under 23 world title, the men's eight won silver and the men's four won a hard-fought battle for bronze.

The venue, which hosted the World Rowing Senior and Junior Championships in 2008, experienced significant damage from flooding in early spring, requiring dramatic, last-minute renovations in preparation for the 2013 World Rowing Under 23 Championships. Entries were received from 52 nations including 811 athletes. Among the most contested events was the lightweight men's single sculls, with 27 entries.

The competition didn't sway 21-year-old Harvard University senior Andrew Campbell, who raced his way into the history books, winning the first-ever gold medal in the event for the United States. It also was the first under 23 gold medal for the U.S. in any men's sculling or lightweight event.

It wasn't Campbell's first podium finish of the year – his Harvard lightweight eight won the IRA title – or his last international race of the season – he would return to international competition at the 2013 World Rowing Championships in Chungju, South Korea, the following month. But it was his first sculling gold medal.

Campbell made quick work of his preliminary races, leading his heat, quarterfinal and semifinal from start to finish. In the final, Campbell was lined up next to The Netherlands' Franciscus Goutier, who had the fastest time of the semifinals. The U.S. sculler maintained a boat-length lead on the field through the 1,500-meter mark and pushed through to win by 2.35 seconds in a 7:07.84. Goutier took silver with a time of 7:10.49, and Ireland's Paul O'Donovan won bronze in a 7:11.67.

Campbell's win in the lightweight single was following by a stunning victory by the U.S. women's eight. The crew had one goal going into the championships, defend its title and bring home a gold medal. With five new rowers in the lineup, the U.S. dominated in the heat, setting themselves up for the final.

Coxswain Kendall Schmidt, Kristine O'Brien, Madison Culp, Amanda Elmore, Courtney Diekema, Corinne Schoeller, Erin Boxberger, Anne Rauschert and Ruth Narode were first off the line, gaining three seconds on the field by the 1,000-meter mark. Great Britain closed the gap slightly in the third 500, but the U.S. charged ahead, crossing the line in a 6:16.81. Great Britain took silver in a 6:19.15, with Germany bronze in a 6:21.61.

For the U.S. men's eight, Linz was a coming-of-age regatta. Shouldered with defending a two-time under 23 world title, the crew finished third in its heat, and then persevered, winning its repechage en route to the final.

In the final, the crew of coxswain Paul Farber, Hunter Leeming, Anders Weiss, Ted Baumgardner, Brendon Stoner, Carter Crowe, Daren Frankel, James Hamp and Max Meyer-Bosse was in last place at the 500-meter mark but worked back through the field and into second by 1,500 meters. New Zealand was third off the line but gained three seconds on the United States going into the sprint. New Zealand charged across the line in 5:28.63, with the U.S. taking silver in 5:31.79. Poland crossed third for the bronze medal in 5:33.16.

It was the men's four that won the first medal of the championships for the United States. Crews endured unseasonably high, late-summer temperatures, delaying the scheduled program on the first day of finals. But at the end of the day, Will Gillis, Kaess Smit, Morgan Gerlak and Edward Benning won a hard-fought battle for bronze, coming in third behind Romania and Australia.

The U.S. crew had finished third in its heat, and advanced with a second-place finish in the repechage. In the final, the young U.S. crew – with two seniors, a junior and a sophomore in the lineup – was in third at each of the 500-meter marks. Romania pushed past Australia in the sprint for the gold medal in 5:58.72. Australia clocked a 6:01.18 for silver, with the U.S. in 6:03.86. The defending under 23 champion Germany, with two returning rowers in the lineup, finished sixth.

The U.S. went to the line in four other medals races but did not reach the podium. In one of the closest finals, the U.S. women's quadruple sculls finished among a pack of six crews separated by just 3.5 seconds.

Advancing directly to the final from the heat, Molly Bruggeman, Britta Syverson, Molly Hamrick and Agatha Nowinski found themselves vying for the bronze medal position with Germany, Italy and New Zealand at the halfway point. But Germany pulled away in the sprint, and Italy and New Zealand edged out the U.S. crew (6:39.86) for fourth (6:39.03) and fifth (6:39.41). Romania won gold in 6:36.35, with Poland silver in 6:36.70 and Germany taking bronze in 6:37.87.

The lightweight women's quadruple sculls crew of Kayla McNeill, Jenna Hebert, Veronique Bourassa and Jamie Roloff ended its world championship run with a fifth-place overall finish.

In the lightweight men's four, Matthew O'Donoghue, Joshua Konieczny, Michael Lindberg and Joseph Hanlon finished sixth, marking only the fifth time in the history of the regatta that a United States lightweight four has reached the final. The highest-ever finish was in 2010, when the U.S. won bronze. The U.S. crew advanced through the reps with a second-place finish to Great Britain and was in third crossing over the 500-meter mark. With Italy and Great Britain out in the lead, it

was a four-boat race for the bronze medal with only a second separating the rest of the field at the 1,000 and 1,500-meter marks. It was France that pushed through for third place in a 6:01.18. Italy won gold in 5:58.53 and Great Britain took silver in 5:59.92. The United States crossed 0.37 seconds behind Germany in sixth, clocking a 6:05.95.

Parker Lange, Oliver Ingram, Maximilian Fenner and Matt Podlesak also finished sixth in the final of the lightweight men's quadruple sculls, recording the best under 23 finish in the event for the U.S. since 2006.
